

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

In 2019, a year before COVID, I was approached by someone who suggested I read *The Cemetery Club* and consider submitting it to BCT. I did so, and the play was added to the 2020-2021 season. Who knew the upheaval in which we'd find ourselves a short while later?

We've gone through so much over the past two and a half years, including self-imposed isolation, restricting our "circle" to a select few, and suffering the loss of family and friends. These themes certainly echo in *The Cemetery Club* and with its characters. Doris remains steadfastly loyal to her now 4-years gone husband and urges her friends to continue their monthly devotions to their departed spouses. Lucille is intent on portraying herself as a "fast and loose" woman, if only to cover up the pain of a broken marriage. Ida finds herself torn between her friends, torn between her wifely duty of devotion, and her desire to live again. *The Cemetery Club* examines life in the wake of death and friendship in the face of tragedy.

With COVID moving from pandemic to endemic, we find ourselves slowly emerging and carefully testing the waters, creating our new normal. We all have had regrets and angry moments over the past few years; we all have had misgivings; we all have had loss. But on top of it all, we all have hope. Much of what we've gone through parallels the lives of the characters in this play and makes *The Cemetery Club* even more memorable.

We hope you enjoy this production, brought to you through the hard work of not only a wonderful cast, but a great crew and other wonderful people who didn't have to help, but certainly came together in the true meaning of "community theater".
